FROM OUR ACTING PRINCIPAL

This week there were some negative reports about the standards of Victorian schools in relation to declining NAPLAN results. Victoria is still a high performing state in relation to other states, being in the top 3 alongside NSW and ACT.

Our results can now be compared to the VIC state averages. When we looked at the percentages of students achieving in the top 2 bands, 6 out of the 10 data sets had AGPS scoring 10% or greater than the Victorian state average. These were Year 3 reading, writing, grammar/punctuation and numeracy and Year 5 reading and writing. These are an excellent set of results and should be celebrated. Well done to our students for their learning progress and to our teachers for their excellent teaching.

World Teachers' Day

The students (and parents) did the teachers proud last week in recognising World Teachers' Day. In our Friday assembly students were asked to select a positive attribute their teacher displayed and describe how they represented the characteristic. It was lovely to see so many students wanting to participate and pay a tribute to their teacher. We also had a visit from Cheryle Osborne (our substantive Principal) who was in

It was excellent to see so many students join us in wearing purple and donating a gold coin to celebrate Purple Day last Monday. This was a fundraiser for the Alannah and Madeline Foundation in which we raised over \$600. In the lead up to this day, students had the option of participating in the Student Council led anti-bullying poster competition, to reinforce some key messages.

Vacation Care

For the past few years we have used Team Kids to provide our vacation care at AGPS. As you will know, it has been a challenging time for them to properly staff our service this year which has resulted in the cancellation of some of their programs. This has meant that students have had to attend the services provided at other

schools. We recognise that this has been far from ideal and have strongly advocated for a consistent program for our parents. We have been in conversations with Their Care, who are keen to take this service on and who are confident that they can keep a quality vacation program running. From this week, the bookings will open for the vacation service run by Their Care, commencing from Monday 9th January, 2023. The program will include a range of additional incursions and excursions.

Year Book Front Cover Competition

We had 115 designs for our Year Book front cover competition this year. Common features on the entries were birds of our Houses (kestrels, falcons, kookaburras, owls), our learner profile attributes, our specialist subjects, our school environment and Buddy Bear.

The winners were announced at our assembly last Friday. Congratulations to Emerson L whose design was chosen for our front cover. The four designs that were selected for the back cover were from Victoria A, Logan H-I, Jordan C-T, Ruby M-B. We look forward to seeing these designs in print on our yearbooks, later in the year.

School Security

Over the past week, we have had two occasions where people have used bolt cutters to cut the links in our entrance beside the bike shed, to gain access. At this stage it just looks like they want to gain access to the school grounds, but we are obviously concerned that damage or theft may occur. We ask our neighbours and local community to be vigilant and report any anti-social behavior they may see after school, at the weekends or during the holidays.

Unexplained Absences

If your child is sick and cannot attend school we ask that parents phone through to the office or complete the absence notification on Compass yourself. It is important that a reason for absence is included. Sending a Dojo message to the class teacher is useful to make the class teacher aware, but this needs to be in addition to marking it on Compass. Thank you for your support with this.

We are beginning to make plans for 2023. This involves organising staffing and classes. If you know that your child will not be attending AGPS next year, please can you let the office know, so that we can plan around our expected numbers for 2023.

Next week your children will be asked to nominate five students who they think would be a supportive friend and good influence on their learning in 2023. The teachers will be using these sociograms when placing the students in to their 2023 classes. Please have a chat with your children, so that they have time to think about and process their choices with some parental guidance. The students will have at least one person from their sociogram allocated to their class.



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
