There have been glimpses of spring this week around school. The sun has had some warmth to it and spring flowers have been poking through the soil. In preparation for more spring weather, Graeme has been marking out a chess board for students to use at recess and lunchtimes.



Year 5 Expedition to Mars Excursion

Our Year 5 classes had an early start to travel to Strathmore for the Mars Expedition Excursion. This is an excursion that is a bit further away than most, but which is well worth it. The sessions involved some programming of Sphero Bots, running communications between the mission control centre and the lab on Mars and completing science experiments which included geology, conditions for growing food and water filtration. The students were very engaged during the activities and were made to think more deeply about the challenges associated with living on Mars.

Cyber Safety and Online Etiquette

When I walked through the library on Wednesday morning the Year 4 students were participating in their Three C's of Cyber Safety' (Contact, Conduct and Content) workshop. They were having a discussion around what is appropriate to be sent through online communications. The presenter talked about the 'Grandma Test' and posed the question to the students, have you ever sent things to other people that you wouldn't say or share with your Grandma? This area of learning is very important, as the students navigate their way safely through the digital world, we hope they do so in a principled way. It is important for all adults to lead by example and reflect on this often with our children.

PYPX2023 - Year 6 Exhibition

Today the Year 6 students will be presenting their PYP Exhibition. The theme is based on the unit 'Where We Are in Place and Time'. Students have engaged in a collaborative, transdisciplinary inquiry process that involves them in identifying, investigating and offering solutions to real-life issues or problems in the world. The students have been working hard on their Exhibitions over the past eight weeks. They have been asked to



present their real-life issues through two writing pieces, one piece that links to a Specialist area and a personal expression of learning. Today, our students will have the opportunity to visit the Year 6 students to hear them present on their inquiry units. The Year 6 students will then present to their parents with an open session between 5pm and 6pm. Good luck Year 6s and well done on your hard work.



Emergency Evacuation

We will be having an emergency evacuation practice next week. This is a vital part of our OH+S calendar, where our processes are put to the test and students experience the sound of the alarm and follow the teacher directions to the assembly point on our oval.

PYP Focus in Year 3

On Monday the 24th of July, the Year 3's participated in a Crazy Chemicals Incursion. It was a fun filled session with lots of hands on science activities that enabled us to make valuable connections to our 'How The World Works' unit of Inquiry.

How The World Works

Central Idea:
Different reactions occur when everyday substances interact.







We brought out our "inner scientist" and conducted experiments, tested hypotheses and observed the chemical reactions of various solids liquids and gases.







During the incursion we got to:

- Discuss what we already knew about everyday materials.
- Make predictions while exploring different materials.
- Discuss the properties of solids, liquids and gases.
- Apply the scientific method while exploring different materials and states of matter.
- Conduct chemical reactions and learn new terminology to describe chemical change, reversible v's irreversible reactions and change in properties.

What's on this week! Cultural Week

This week, we are focusing on learning about and exploring each other's cultures via discussion and activities. We have created cultural handprints in which children paint the flag of the country to which they feel the most connected to on their palm and print it on of paper, which will then be displayed at our service.

We will also undertake a letter writing activity in which the children will write letters detailing their understanding of their cultures and share them with the other children in service.

During before school care, just before dismissing the children to class, we form a yarning circle in which a focus question is posed and we move around the circle asking for the children's responses. A scribe is assigned to record the children's responses, and the children have demonstrated respect by listening to their peers share their responses.

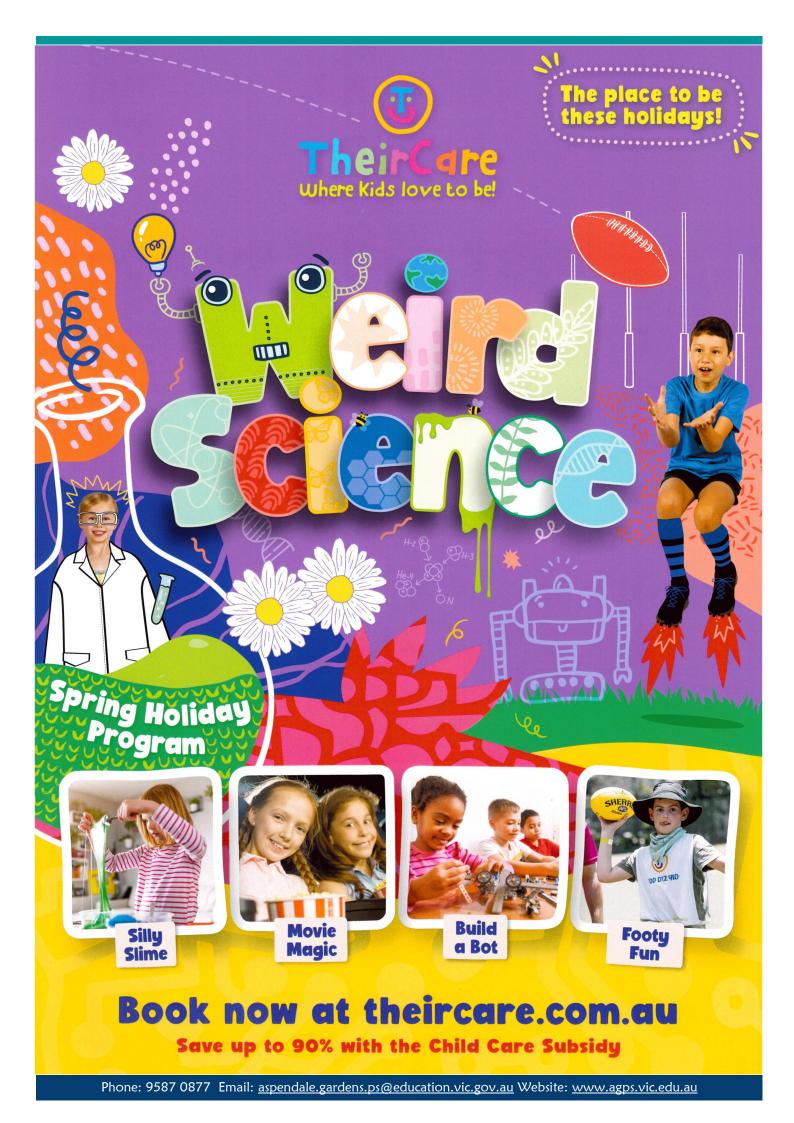
